

# President's Letter - Winter Issue

I would like to share some ideas taken from the OCDA Conference on Church Music held in Cuyahoga Falls. From Frank Jacob's lecture on church choir rehearsals:

1. Always start on time.

2. Put a plan for the rehearsal on the board - the choir knows you are organized and it's a good check for yourself to know you are not doing the "same old things in the same old order".

3. The rehearsal must include elements of Freshness - rephrase familiar phrases - sing in other locations in the church - have sectionals - have one group listen to another - tape the choir - sing in scrambled positions (how many church choirs do this?)

Consider the facial expressions of the choir as they sing various styles and texts.

5. Rehearse in reverse - start at the end of a piece and work forward.

Also from Frank's lecture: He considers the church music program pictured as an equalateral triangle having these three equal parts - spiritual, musical and social . . . it would be good for all of us to make a little diagram like that and put it in our choir folder to see if we are really meeting those needs for our church choir members.

From Dr. Joy Lawrence's demonstration on using the hymnal in a crative way: She suggests we can use the hymnal in any one of the following ways:

1. For Bible Study

2. For Poetry

3. For Religious Symbolism

4. To Show Various Styles

5. To help explain the church year

6. As Anthems

7. For Liturgical Study

8. For Movement

Try a -plainsong as a processional using bells - all you need are two bells - tonic and dominant - it can't be done wrong - a really neat idea.

Try making an anthem out of a hymn by alternating groups, either by verse or phrase - such as - choir/congregation, solo/choir or men/women. So much can be done with the




