REFLECTIONS OF A PRESIDENT



Greetings from Scandinavia! My family and I have been in Skåne, the southern-most region of Sweden, since the last week of July, and we are enjoying our experience very much. We arrived two and a half weeks before the official faculty exchange began so that we could enjoy a family vacation here. During that time we visited cathedrals, castles, and Copenhagen; and we even swam in the Baltic Sea!

My work this year consists of three parts: 1) teaching four days per week at a public high school, the equivalent of U.S. grades seven through ten in a

"music magnet" type of setting; 2) teaching two choral methods classes for a university; and 3) directing a select community chorus. I have worked at the high school for several weeks now, and am enjoying working with that age group again on a regular basis. My three wonderful Swedish choral colleagues and I meet every week to plan together and to help one other. It is the positive and supportive work environment that all of us should have!

I am pleased to announce the clinicians for our 2006 summer conference. Bob Chilcott will join us from the United Kingdom, and Ann Howard Jones from Boston. Emily Ellsworth of the Glen Ellyn Children's Choir will serve as director of our second honors chorus for children.

Congratulations and thanks to Tom Merrill and Gayle Walker for their leadership in producing the successful, attendance-record-breaking 2005 summer conference! Tom has served our organization well as president, and we are grateful to Gayle for her fine service as conference chair for the past five years. As it is now time for Gayle to step away from that responsibility, I am pleased to announce the appointment of a conference committee, whose members will share the responsibilities previously assumed by the conference chair. Daniel Monek has agreed to serve as chair of the conference committee. Hugh Floyd, Amy Lenzmeier, and Ann Usher have joined Dan as members of the committee. We appreciate the willingness of these OCDA members to serve our organization in this way.

Finally, I want to wish all of you back in Ohio a wonderful and productive year of teaching and music making. It is a privilege to do the work that we do, and I challenge each one of us to remember – even on those *really* long teaching days this year – that it is indeed a privilege to be a choral musician. Of course this privilege carries with it much responsibility. It really should not be "all about *us*, *the choral directors*," but about the music and about those in our ensembles before whom we are privileged to stand and celebrate our art!

2005 OCDA SUMMER CONFERENCE - REFRESHING!

The OCDA Summer Conference has always been a time of renewal. Colleagues across the state become reacquainted, conference participants dive into learning together, and we are reminded of the many reasons we are in the field of choral music. This year's conference was all the more exciting because its size; 187 participants registered for the conference, a record number. Thank you to all who came to share your voices, energy, and enthusiasm; and to all who registered for the conference as new OCDA members, welcome!

Numerous leaders in the choral field brought their expertise to headline the conference schedule of events. Rebecca Rottsolk opened the conference with sessions on effective and inspirational teaching, as well as healthy singing for developing voices. Eric Whitacre, recognized as one of the finest choral composers of our day, performed and discussed his music, and co-conducted the OCDA Director's Chorus with Lynda Hasseler. In addition to her work with the Director's Chorus, Dr. Hasseler led sessions on choral warm-ups, and conducted the Capital Chapel Choir in a moving performance at Linworth United Methodist Church. Additionally, Grant Cook shared his research on the work of Ignaz Karl Dirzka, the chorus master for the premiers of Beethoven's Missa Solemnis and 9th Symphony. The presentations by all of the clinicians were varied, interesting, lively, and informative.

A new event was introduced at the OCDA Summer Conference this year – the OCDA Children's Honor Choir. Conducted by Rebecca Rottsolk, the choir consisted of 150 elementary students selected by their general music teachers. Con Brio, a children's choir conducted by Emily Hil, also perfomed on the Honor Choir concert. The organization of the Honor Choir event, the experiences shared by teachers and students, and the final concert were all a resounding success. Many thanks to Robin Lana and her team for their hard work in bringing the Honor Choir to the conference! Watch for continued Honor Choir events in next year's OCDA Summer Conference.

The Trinity United Methodist Church Choir, conducted by Rich Schnipke, performed on Tuesday night of the conference. The quality of this fine church choir, as well as that of all of the ensembles performing at the conference, was very high.

In addition to fine clinicians and choral concerts, the 2005 Summer Conference included multiple reading sessions, dinner rountable sessions, a business luncheon, and a social *gemütlichkeit*.

If you were not able to attend the 2005 Summer Conference, make plans now to attend the 2006 conference, June 19-21, at Otterbein College in Westerville, OH. Clinicians will include Bob Chilcott, Ann Howard Jones, and Emily Ellsworth, who will also conduct the Honor Choir. Be on the lookout for more information regarding the upcoming conference: flyers will be distributed at upcoming OMEA and ACDA conventions, postcards will be sent to OCDA members in early winter, and the registration brochure will be mailed in April.

The 2005 OCDA Summer Conference was my last as Conference Coordinator. I am pleased to announce that Dr. Daniel Monek of Marietta College will be leading next year's outstanding conference committee. The conference is in very good hands, indeed. I would like to thank the OCDA Board for their wisdom and assistance during the past four years, as well as the numerous OCDA members and colleagues who jumped in to help in a myriad of ways. I would also like to thank the OCDA membership for being the friendly, committed, and musical people you are.



- area(s) and level at which you prefer to assist
- elementary school/middle school/high school/church/community/etc.
- any other information which you feel would be helpful

It is not my intent to make this a difficult or long term situation for any volunteer. Some groups may have the finances to offer a small honorarium which could, at the very least, cover transportation costs. This would be entirely between you and the conductor with whom you would work.

Many of you may already be a mentor or doing some type of clinics with area schools and churches. Thanks for being involved and furthering the cause of outstanding choral conducting and teaching. Please let me know of your involvement, so that we may learn from your experiences.


